
Key Points

- Migration from graded system to Binary Accreditation with Maturity Based Graded Levels (1 5).
 - Reiterating the earlier decision, it was decided to accept IIQA applications under present methodology (RAF) until 30th June 2024 (6.00 PM).
 - HEIs with valid accreditation as per the present RAF whose validity is expiring between 1st July 2024 and date of launch of Maturity Based Graded Levels (MBGL) shall be extended for a maximum period of three months after the launch of MBGL.
 - HEIs already accredited shall continue to hold the accreditation with the grade till its validity exists. During such a valid period of accreditation, such institutes may apply for Maturity Based Graded Level at any time once the MBGL is announced.
 - HEIs whose IIQA or SSR applications are under RAF:
 - a) may opt for Binary accreditation (in such a case, the ongoing A & A process under RAF will be closed)

OR

- b) may decide to go ahead for A & A process under the current RAF.
- HEIs who are not accredited shall apply for Binary accreditation as and when it is launched.

Maturity-Based Graded Accreditation

Under this framework, the HEIs will be graded between the range of Level 1 to Level 5. The intent behind this system is to motivate the institutions to climb from Levels 1 to 4 i.e. "Institutions of National Excellence" and to reach the highest Level 5 to label themselves as "Institutions of Global Excellence for Multi-Disciplinary Research and Education".

- Data Required 3 years
 - One Nation One Data Platform to be available yearround.
- Validity 3 years
- Peer validation from select institutes.
- No physical visit until dispute.
- AQAR submission required.
